

# 2025/2026 NATIONAL EXAMINATIONS REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

## 1. Introduction

NESA organizes national examinations at the end of each academic year for Primary Six (P6), Senior Three (S3), and Senior Six (S6) / Level 5 / Year 3. This guide outlines the registration procedures for both school-based and private candidates.

## 2. Registration Timeline

**Start Date:** Wednesday, February 25, 2026.

**Deadline:** Friday, March 27, 2026.

**Platform:** School Data Management System (SDMS).

**Responsible:**

- Head teachers for school-based candidates.
- Private candidates (they register themselves in SDMS. Candidates attending private coaching centres must select the centres where they receive coaching).

## 3. Registration for School-Based Candidates

### 3.1. Eligibility Criteria

S6 / L5 / Y3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Completed successfully the S3 National Examinations</li> <li>- Completed S4–S6 (or Y1–Y3 / L3–L5) without skipping grades or changing combinations</li> <li>- Registered in SDMS with clear and recent passport photo</li> <li>- A National Identification Card or Passport.</li> <li>- The information entered in SDMS must exactly match records from the National Identification Agency (NIDA) to prevent errors. If a candidate does not yet have a National ID, they may be registered using their full names, but schools must take extra care to ensure the accuracy of all personal details.</li> </ul> <p><i><b>Note:</b> Students who passed S3 National Exams before the 2021/2022 academic year, or who studied in other education systems are required to provide a S3 result confirmation or equivalence certificate and report cards for the previous two school years (S4/L3/Y1 and S5/L4/Y2).</i></p>

### 3.2. Candidate Photo & Document Support

Schools must assist students with clear and recent passport photos and document scanning **free of charge**.

### 3.3. School Selection & Orientation Choices for P6 and S3 candidates

All Primary Six (P6) and Senior Three (S3) candidates are requested to select the schools where they wish to continue their studies—either in day schools or boarding schools.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to actively participate in this process and to confirm the identity details of their children to ensure accuracy and transparency.

Each P6 and S3 candidate is therefore requested to:

Choose **4 boarding schools** and **2-day schools**.

S3 candidates must include **at least two orientations/trades from Technical Secondary School (TSS)** among the four boarding schools.

S3 Candidates will choose from **36 orientations** across **Technical Secondary Schools, Professional Education, and General Education**:

**Note:**

- a. ***Subject combinations that were phased out in previous school years are no longer available for examination registration***
- b. *Unlike the 2024/2025 repeating candidates and private candidates in General Education—some of whom did not sit for all examinations due to the phasing out of certain combinations—all candidates for the 2025/2026 school year (both school-based and private) will sit for the same set of examination papers.*
- c. *Students with disabilities shall have equal access to all orientations, trades, and pathways. Disability must never be used as a criterion to restrict or deny registration or admission to any program.*

### **3.5. Parents Involvement in Candidate Registration**

Parents or guardians must be actively involved in guiding students' school choices before the registration process begins. In addition, **parents' contact details (phone numbers) must be accurately entered in SDMS** to ensure that each parent receives all notifications related to the national examination process on behalf of their child.

Once a candidate is registered, an **SMS** will be sent to the parent or guardian confirming the selected schools. ***If any changes need to be made, the parent must notify IMMEDIATELY the school before the registration application for their child is validated.***

School leaders are responsible for accurately recording each student's choices, ensuring that parent's input is respected and properly documented.

### **3.6. School Administration Responsibilities**

The school administration is responsible for:

Ensuring accurate candidate data in SDMS (names, gender, ID, birthdate, residence, parent / guardian contact, students' choices, information on student's disability).

Verifying all registration forms before submission.

Prevent duplication and mismatches—S6/Y3/L5 candidates must use their National ID.

Verifying student's IDs into SDMS.

Printing and securely storing registration forms.

Notifying parents via SMS after registration; corrections must be made promptly.

School leaders for the selected Practical Examination Centres are requested to support Private Candidates to sit for Practical Examinations: Teaching Practice (TTC), Integrated Assessments (TSS), ICT in Accounting (ACC) and Science Practical assessment (PBA).

### **3.7. Role of NESA inspectors and District & Sector Education Officials**

NESA inspectors, in collaboration with District Directors of Education (DDEs) and District Education Officers (DEOs), are responsible for overseeing the smooth execution of the online registration process.

Sector Education Inspectors (SEIs) must monitor the process daily and collect reports from schools to ensure no student is left unregistered in their sector of responsibility.

### **3.8. Role of Data Processing Officers (DPOs)**

The role of Data Processing Officers (DPOs) is to support Head Teachers with SDMS registration tasks throughout the entire registration period. In addition, DPOs are responsible for assisting in the identification of learners with disabilities or Special Educational Needs (SEN), ensuring their accurate registration, and facilitating the provision of appropriate examination accommodations.

### **3.9. Special attention to Special Needs Candidates**

The School Data Management System (SDMS) includes categories for students with disabilities. **Head Teachers must document each learner's support needs to guarantee equitable access to National Examinations and school placement.** They must also ensure that all information related to students with disabilities is accurately recorded in SDMS.

School administrators, Sector Education Inspectors (SEIs), Data Processing Officers (DPOs), District Education Officers (DEOs), and District Directors of Education (DDEs) are collectively responsible for the early identification of learners with disabilities or Special Educational Needs (SEN), their accurate registration, and the provision of appropriate examination accommodations.

## 4. Registration for Private Candidates

### 4.1. Who Can Register as a Private Candidate?

Eligible individuals include:

Those who previously sat A-Level exams in Rwanda or abroad (with verified certificates).

Those who completed O-Level at least **five years ago (2020/2021 school year or earlier)**.

Those who completed S3 before 2000 school year (when no S3 national exams were conducted).

Holders of qualification acquired in Rwanda previously: **A3, A4, D4, D5, ENI** (Ecole Normale Inférieure), **EMP** (Ecole Moyenne Pédagogique), **EMM** (Ecole Ménagère Moyenne), **EAP** (Ecole d'Apprentissage Pédagogique), **EMA** (Ecole de Moniteur Auxiliaire), **ENA** (Ecole Normale Auxiliaire), **ENTA** (Ecole Normale Technique Auxiliaire), **Section Familiale**, **CERAR** (Centre d'Education Rurale et Artisanale au Rwanda) or **CERAI** (Centre d'Education Rurale et Artisanale Intégrée).

TTC candidates with verified practical marks from previous years.

### 4.2. Required documents and fees

Valid National ID or passport (foreigners only).

Verified certificates or result confirmations.

Passport-size photo ( $\leq 200$ kb, white background, ears visible).

Payment of non-refundable 15,000 RWF through "**Irembo**" portal.

**Note:**

- *Pay only after receiving a bill number and PIN from Irembo. Bills numbers expire after 5 days and **are not renewable**.*
- *Foreign Candidates without a Rwandan National ID document should obtain payment confirmation via their email from NESA before making any payments. They get a phone call from NESA staff as well.*

### 4.3. Registration Process

Register via SDMS ([www.sdms.gov.rw](http://www.sdms.gov.rw)).

Choose one district in which he/she will sit for National Examinations.

**Note:**

- a. *Private candidates are required to complete their registration independently. If a candidate opts to register through a third party—such as Irembo shops or Private Candidate Coaching Centres—they shall bear full responsibility for any errors or omissions that may occur during the registration process.*
- b. *The private candidates attending the coaching centres for national examination preparation are requested to register within these respective Coaching centres as indicated in SDMS*
- c. *TTC private candidates must register through any TTC school of their choice. Practical exams are organized by the school.*
- d. *Foreign private candidates without Rwandan ID must email documents to [privforeigners@nesa.gov.rw](mailto:privforeigners@nesa.gov.rw)*
- e. *The Private Candidate Index Number formatted as follows:  
**DistrictCode** + **PC** + **CombinationCode** + **CandidateSerialNumber** + **SchoolYear**.  
Example: **12PCPCB0052026***

#### 4.4. Examination Centres

Each district has one or more number of Private Candidate Examination Centres.

Validated candidates must sit for examinations in the district where they registered. **No changes of examination centres are permitted.** The list of examination centres where validated private candidates will sit for practical and theory examinations will be published on the NESAS website at least two weeks before the start of the exams.

#### 4.5. Other information on registration for Private Candidates

***Subject combinations that were phased out in previous school years are no longer available for examination registration***

Unlike the 2024/2025 repeating candidates and private candidates in General Education—some of whom did not sit for all examinations due to the phasing out of certain combinations—all candidates for the 2025/2026 academic year (both school-based and private) will sit for the same set of examination papers.

**Carrying forward grades** achieved in previous A-Level National Examinations **is not permitted.** Any candidate wishing to retake A-Level National examinations is required to **retake all subjects** within their chosen subject combination, option or trade.

**Examination malpractices:** It is imperative that every candidate adheres to the established rules and regulations governing National Examinations. Non-compliance will lead to appropriate disciplinary measures and penalties in accordance with the guidelines and regulations governing National Examinations. Detailed guidelines will be provided to candidates separately.

**Falsification of documents:** If candidate is found to have registered using falsified documents, she/he will be disqualified upon the revelation of his/her ineligibility to register as a Private Candidate. Additionally, he/she will be reported to appropriate authorities (e.g. RIB) for further legal actions.

**Requirements for Identification at Examination Centres:** All registered Private Candidates are required to present a printed registration form issued by NESAS and obtained from SDMS registration portal along with a valid National Identity Card for all examination sessions.

The National Examinations timetable will be published on NESA's three months before the first day of National Examinations.






### 2025/2026 National Examination registration process - PRIMARY 6




## 2025/2026- National Examination registration process - Senior 3


- **Passport Photo** (200Kb /JPE Format)


